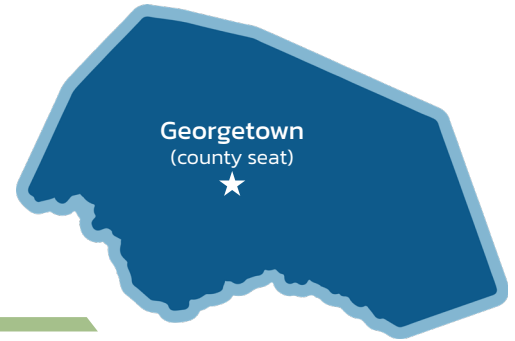




Williamson County FACT SHEET

HISTORY

Williamson County is centrally located in Texas just north of the State Capitol in Austin. Its major cities are Round Rock, Cedar Park, Georgetown, Leander, Taylor and Hutto. Williamson County is home to growing communities, thriving restaurants, diverse natural resources and a strong economy with businesses such as Dell, Apple and Samsung.



ORGANIZATION

Williamson County is a political subdivision of the State of Texas. It has no legislative powers and restrictive judicial and administrative powers. The governing body of the County is the commissioners court. The court is comprised of the county judge and four commissioners elected by their precincts. One of the primary duties of the court is to adopt the county budget and adopt the tax rate. The tax rate for fiscal year 2023-24 is \$0.377445 per \$100 of valuation.



GROWTH

Williamson County is the **third fastest** growing county in the state of Texas for the past **12 years** with a growth rate of **162.9%**.

HEALTH

Williamson County is ranked the **third healthiest** county in Texas among the 244 ranked counties in Texas. All counties are ranked using a variety of data factors, which measure the rate of education, housing, crime, employment, unhealthy behaviors, and exercise. It is home to several hospitals including Ascension Seton, Baylor Scott & White, Cedar Park Regional Medical Center, Dell Children's Medical Center and St. David's.

PARKS

Williamson County has **2,992.66 acres** of parkland, **4,843.86 acres** of preserves and **50 miles** of hiking and biking trails.
